Successful Learning

Northcote College teachers are committed to student learning. They deliver the lessons and provide the guidance and the best assistance they can to help all students learn.

In order for Year 9 students to get the full benefit of their teachers' help and the most out of lessons they need to do two things:

1. Pay attention, work hard and learn as much as they can in class.
2. Commit to spending **at least one hour after school each day** to:
 - Complete any unfinished class work
 - Complete homework tasks and assignments
 - Organise and review the day's school work
 - Note any work they don't understand so they can get help

Doing these things will help your child learn to work independently and establish the excellent work habits he/she will need to succeed in the senior school and learning beyond school.

Year 9 Course Requirements

All Year 9 students will:

- study English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Physical Education and Health, Food Technology and Information & Communication Technology.
- experience each of The Arts and choose one as a focus for a half year option course from: Art/Drama/Music
- experience technology subjects and will choose two from: Electronics/Fashion Technology/Graphics/ Hard Materials Technology
- experience a language subject and will choose one from: French/Japanese/Maori/Spanish/ESOL/Literacy Support

Year 9 Form Classes

Students are placed in a Form Class. Each Form Class is named using the Form Teacher's code which is based on their surname. Students who have chosen to be part of the Whanau Class are in vertical form classes with Whanau class students from other year levels.

It is intended that students stay in the same Form Class and that Mr Wallace and Ms Royal (the Year 9 and Whanau Deans) and the Year 9 Form Teachers will stay with the form level throughout their time at Northcote College.

The Timetable

Northcote College runs a six day timetable. There are five one hour periods per day. There are 30 periods over 6 days.

Student Diary

A Student Diary is issued to each Year 9 student by their form teacher. The diary is designed to help organise school time, school work and homework. It is also a means of communication between home and school.

Using the Student Diary is compulsory for Year 9 students who must have it with them in every class, including form period, and take it home each night.

Homework Centre

The Homework Centre is open each lunch time in C8. This is the place for students to come if they need to ask a question about how to do a piece of work or how to work out a problem in any subject. There will be a staff member on duty each day from 12.45 to 1.25pm. Students can stay just a few minutes to ask the question or for half an hour to complete work. Sometimes a student may be referred to the Homework Centre by a subject teacher if homework has not been completed and this is intended to provide them with a suitable environment and time to complete the set tasks.

Card System

Blue and Red Cards are in use throughout the school.

Blue cards may be issued for quality work or improved behaviour. Once a student has earned five blue cards from teachers they are eligible for a 'reward' simply by presenting the cards to the Office.

Red cards are sent home for a parent signature, along with any coursework required, and are to be returned by the student to the Resource Room the next day. They signal a problem to the parent early, before it becomes a major issue. A red card might be issued if homework is not done or a student comes to class without the correct equipment. The reason for the card is written on it each time. If a problem recurs the Dean will take appropriate action. Should you have concerns about your child's progress please contact the Dean who will be happy to help you.

Library

The school library is open for student use every afternoon (except Friday) until 4.30pm.

A photocopier is available for student use in the library. Students purchase photocopy cards from the librarian.

Extra-curricular Activities

Sport and Cultural Activities are an important part of the Northcote College experience. A wide range of sporting codes is offered at the College and many opportunities for students to be involved in other areas that interest them; eg Drama/Performance, Jazz Band, Orchestra, Theatresports, Cultural Groups and more.

School Rules

The Northcote College school rules are based on respect. They are designed to ensure that an atmosphere of hard work, courtesy and concern for others is maintained. A full copy of the school rules is included in the back of this booklet.

Attendance

All students must arrive by 8.55am and be in class by 9.00am and attend all timetabled classes while at school unless otherwise directed by a staff member.

If your child must be absent from school for a period of time during the day please send a note, preferably with the appointment card, to request a leave pass, giving the reason for absence, the time of departure and estimated time to return to school. The student needs to bring this note to the Dean's Office before 9am or during interval to obtain a 'leave pass' which then allows the student to leave class at the appropriate time and go straight to their appointment. Upon return to school the student reports to the Dean's Office before returning to class.

Should time off school for a day or longer (other than sickness) be required then a formal letter of request should be addressed to the Principal, preferably four weeks in advance of the anticipated leave.

In the event of your child being unable to attend school due to illness please contact the Attendance Office, on the morning of absence, extension 750 and leave your child's name, form class and reason for absence.

Health Centre

Northcote College has a School Nurse on duty in the Health Centre between 10am and 2pm daily. Students who become unwell at College must report to the nurse. Students must not leave the College without permission. Parents will be contacted if the student requires further medical assistance or needs to be collected.

Uniform/Dress

The uniform is worn by students in Years 9, 10, 11 and 12. New uniform is purchased from Yarntons, Birkenhead.

Parental Contribution 2010

Northcote College requests a donation from each family who has a child attending the School.

The Board of Trustees has set the parental contribution for attendance at Northcote College in the 2010 school year at \$250 per student. For families with two or more students attending the School the total requested contribution is \$500.

The parental donation to the School helps the Board fund the educational opportunities that Northcote College provides and allows important projects, programmes and initiatives for students to be developed and sustained. We are justifiably proud of the programmes and projects we offer.

At Northcote College we are striving to improve effectiveness and efficiency. However, financial stress on schools has grown as information technology requirements rise, compliance costs increase and the curriculum changes.

- Without the income generated by the parent donations each year Northcote College would struggle to operate.
- Northcote College is a Decile 9 school which puts it at the second lowest level of targeted funding from the Government per student.
- Operational funding is expected to cover learning resources (books, equipment, classroom materials), Board funded teacher salaries, support staff salaries, professional development, maintenance of buildings and grounds and all information technology and administration costs.
- The school donation is an important contributor to the school's annual operating income.
- Only 50% of the Northcote College annual operating budget is funded from government grants. The remaining income is 'locally raised'. School donations from parents contribute to 'locally raised' income.

A receipt will be issued for all contributions received and contributions are income tax deductible.

If you have any queries regarding payment of the contribution please contact the Accounts Office Ph 481 0146.

Payment of the donation remains voluntary. However, the school relies on these contributions. I trust you will support Northcote College in this way and in so doing ensure a quality education for all students.

Subject Fees

Activity fees are charged to cover the cost of take home materials in some subjects, eg Art and Fashion. Northcote College endeavours to keep these charges to a minimum. Payment arrangements can be made through the Accounts Office and financial assistance is available in cases of extreme hardship.

ID Cards

The Student ID card is necessary for the issue of books from the school library. Class photos and photos for ID cards will be taken on Wednesday 10 February 2010. \$5 is payable on the day for the ID cards which will be available by the end of February.

School Shop and Stationery

The College Shop is open Monday - Thursday during school terms from 11am to 1.30pm for the purchase of stationery items, second-hand uniforms (when available) and sports uniforms.

2010 Stationery lists will be available on the Northcote College website, or from the School Office, from early December 2009.

The school shop will open extended back-to-school hours from Wednesday 28th January for the purchase of workbooks and second hand uniforms only. Please telephone 4810141 extension 744 for times.

Personal Property

It is important to name all items a student wears or brings to school so that anything misplaced can quickly and easily be returned to the owner. If something is lost then the student should visit the Resource Room where items are held.

Valuable items, including iPods and other personal entertainment systems, should not be brought to school and no responsibility is taken by the school for loss or damage. Mobile phones are permitted at school but must be switched off and out of sight during school hours. Urgent personal mobile phone messages may be checked at the office without penalty during interval and lunchtime. Cell phones or electronic items seen or heard during the school day will be confiscated and are available for collection from the main office by the parent/caregiver only.

Year 9 2010

All Year 9 students will

- complete a full year course in: English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science and Physical Education
- be exposed to short (eg: 1 term) compulsory courses in: Food Technology, Maori, ICT, The Arts and Health and Financial Literacy
- study option subjects from: The Arts, Technology and Languages

OPTION SUBJECTS

The option structure is designed to keep student courses as broad as possible. Students are able to choose courses from The Arts, Technology and Languages. A brief outline of the content of each option subject is provided overleaf.

THE ARTS

All Year 9 students will be exposed to each of the Arts subjects.

The student chooses ONE half year option from: Art, Music and Drama.

The other two Arts subjects not selected will be taught in short modules as part of the core programme. For example a student may choose to study Art as a half year option and so in addition will complete a one term module in each of Music and Drama.

TECHNOLOGIES

All Year 9 students will be exposed to four Technology subjects including two compulsory modules in Food and Information Technology, and two of their own choosing.

All Year 9 students will choose TWO short Technology options from: Graphics, Fashion, Hard Materials Technology and Electronics.

LANGUAGES

All students are encouraged to study a language (French, Japanese, Spanish, Te Reo Maori) in Year 9. Each language course runs for the full year.

or

Year 9 students who do not wish to study a language may choose English for Speakers of Other Languages or literacy and numeracy support.

EXTENSION

Extension Art, Extension Literature, Humanities and Extension Science courses are also available to eligible students and programmes can be individualised within the option structure.

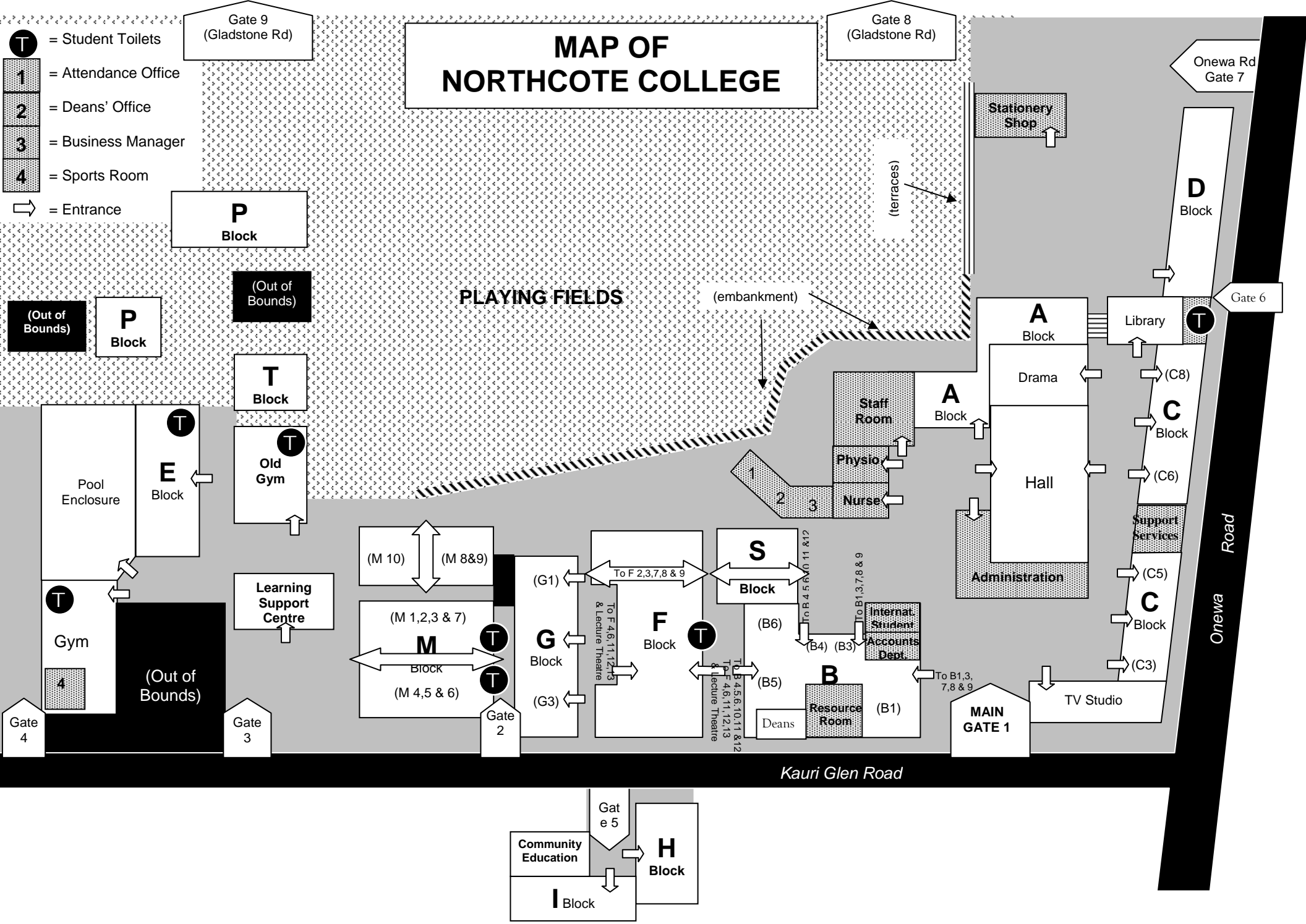
