Te Whānau o Te Kākano is a form class for the Year 9 to 13 based on principles of tuakana teina. Over the years, the kaupapa of the whanau class has revised with input from the whānau and community.

Te Kaupapa o Te Whānau o Te Kākano

Te Whānau o Te Kākano provides a Māori pathway for students and their whānau in Northcote College to draw from the strength of their identity to achieve their academic potential.

It provides students with an opportunity to be in an environment that embraces all aspects of Tikanga and Te Reo Māori. It allows students to flourish within Te Ao Māori and the wider school.

Celebrating and maintaining identity as Māori in Te Whānau o Te Kākano, enhances the development to become confident, connected educated Tangata Whenua of Aotearoa New Zealand.

Te Whānau o Te Kākano

The whānau class is made up of students from Years 9 to Year 13.

Year 9 and 10 students will travel with mainstream classes, known as the 'travelling class', in every subject area except in their half-year options. Years 11, 12, and 13 take individual options and therefore, where possible, are placed together for support. This structure enables students to study at levels appropriate to their ability.

The Whānau class consists of 3 kaiako:

Te Whānau o Te Kākano aims:

- To encourage cultural pride among the students.
- To promote Te Reo Māori and Tikanga Māori within the whānau class and the wider school.
- To provide support for students in their wider subject areas.
- For students to value education and develop a sense of purpose and direction for the future.

We will provide students with opportunities to be involved in Marae noho, Kapahaka and historical and cultural events. The Whānau class will also provide a Turangawaewae that will nurture the students' sense of belonging and self-esteem.

Enrolment in Te Whānau o Te Kākano

All students enrolled in Northcote College are welcome to apply to be a member of Te Whānau o Te Kākano regardless of ethnicity. However, enrolment into Te Whānau o Te Kākano is not automatic. Each application is assessed and the following entry criteria applies.

- Student, parent/caregiver attends an entry interview with Matua Stan Conrad and the Whanau Form Teachers.
- Parents commit to attending at least four Whānau Hui per year in support of their tauira.
- Students commit to working hard individually and as a group with dedication to achieving their true potential.
- A commitment to the kaupapa of the Whānau.
- A commitment to fostering Te Reo and Tikanga Māori.
- A commitment to active participation in the Kapahaka group.

Application Process

- Year 9 and 10 tauira are invited to apply for a place in Te Whānau o Te Kākano at the time of enrolment. You must submit your applications to the School Office no later than Thursday 4th November 2021.
- Tauira and their whānau will then be invited for an interview with whānau kaiako and the Year Level Dean.
- During the interview, we will discuss the kaupapa and expectations for being in Te Whānau o Te Kākano, as well as the goals and expectations for whānau and tauira.
- Once all interviews have been completed, letters will be issued to the whanau informing them of the outcome of the application.
- Year 11 to 13 tauira can apply to join Te Whānau o Te Kākano by completing an application form. Applications by Year 11 to 13 tairua will be processed and families invited for interviews in Term 2 (for a Term 3 start) and Term 4 (for a Term 1 start the following academic year).
- Once all interviews have been completed, letters will be issued to the whanau.
