

MATARIKI CELEBRATIONS

Northcote Primary

Mānawatia a Matariki! He miharo te whakanui a Matariki i te kura tuatahi o Northcote! |

The celebrations for Matariki at Northcote Primary school early in the morning on Tuesday 27 June were amazing! Each team collaborated to create an installation to celebrate the nine stars of Matariki.

Willow Park Primary

Our annual Matariki evening was a great celebration of whanaungatanga with seven hangi cookers going and Matariki activities for our whānau and guests. Our kapa haka had their first formal appearance and wowed the crowds with their heart felt performance.

Birkenhead Primary

We celebrated Matariki with a combination of in-class and whole-school activities. We had a lunchtime where the tamariki were able to come along and join in a variety of activities, including craft, singing, and art. Hiwa-i-terangi, one of the nine stars in the Matariki star cluster - known as the 'wishing star' - has a connection to our hopes, dreams and aspirations for the year ahead. Inspired by Hiwa-i-te-rangi, the tamariki created stars on which they wrote their wishes for the new year.

In class, we explored ideas including: the names and associated tikanga of the nine stars, stories linked to Matariki, reflection on the year that has been, goals for the future, preparing and sharing food with class and whānau.







Northcote Intermediate

As part of the Te Ara Awataha opening, Northcote Intermediate joined a community hikoi which also doubled as the blessing for the opening of the path that connects the school to the walkway. As part of the build up to the hikoi, students made lanterns and learned about the history of the awa. Northcote Intermediate has been spending time forging links with local organisations to strengthen their understanding of local history and the role we can play as quardians of our environment.



Northcote College

We had a magical evening under the stars celebrating Matariki. The event, held on Friday 28 July, empowered and showcased Māori student leadership and identity, modeling diversity and unity within our community.

The celebrations included kapa haka performances by Northcote Intermediate (leader, Bronwyn Babbage), Birkenhead Primary (leaders, Ben Nathan and Kelli Kawhia-Conrad) and Northcote College (leaders, Kelli Kawhia-Conrad and Shaunee Hiha). There was delicious kai - including hāngi and fried bread; arts and crafts for the children; Polynesian sailing and wayfinding with Stan Conrad; mahi raranga - weaving - with Kiriana O'Connell; kōrero about the Matariki stars in the 'Stellarium' by Teira Tohu; Te Kāpehu Whetū - Māori star compass - with Shaunee Hiha and Stan Conrad; market stalls and the launch of our very own Matariki earrings collection (designed by Stan Conrad).

Onepoto Primary School

Onepoto also joined the community hīkoi, and Lofty Ned & his team from Kainga Ora came beforehand to run a Matariki Lantern Making workshop for our Senior students.

We also had a gorgeous Matariki-Kaitiaki Planting Day! The sun warmed our hearts as we planted trees with our whanau & the Kai Cooker lunch warmed our hungry puku (tummy).
